
Dear Governor-Elect Christie:

Congratulations on you on your recent victory, and, in particular, your brave stance in support of parents of vaccine-injured children and others concerned with vaccine-choice. As one of the nation's few attorneys whose practice involves assisting people around the country with vaccine legal exemptions and waivers in a wide variety of situations, I can say with certainty that concerned citizens around the country were watching the New Jersey gubernatorial race, and are now applauding your victory and recognition of this critical issue.

Vaccine concerns transcend political boundaries. I have been a democrat all of my life (I'm 52 now), but would promptly and unhesitatingly vote for a non-democratic candidate who supports vaccine choice. I am not alone. There is a growing body of voters around the country concerned about vaccine mandates, both routine and potential emergency ones. We applaud your recognition of New Jersey citizens' concerns about vaccine choice, and will support your leadership role as a model for other state governors, so that they, too, will better understand and recognize vaccine choice concerns. The bottom line is that the scientific data pertinent to a complete and proper cost-benefit analysis of immunizations is sufficiently contradictory and unclear as to require that citizens be granted to right to determine, on an individual basis and in consultation with their healthcare practitioner, whether or not vaccines are appropriate for them and their children. Government should require that vaccine injury and death be risked by all members of society, where safe and effective alternatives exist, and where the pharmaceutical industry reaps enormous profits while incurring no liability for the death and disability caused by their vaccines.

Please make vaccine choice a high priority issue in New Jersey. You have the support of not only your own constituents, but also that of concerned parents and citizens around the country. If there is anything I can to do assist you at any time on this matter, please do not hesitate to ask.
